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### **ERIE MSA UNEMPLOYMENT RATE AT 3.6% IN FEBRUARY**

**HARRISBURG (APRIL 2) –** The seasonally adjusted unemployment rate for the Erie Metropolitan Statistical Area (MSA) declined one-tenth of a percentage point over the month to 3.6 percent in February 2024. The statewide rate was unchanged at 3.4 percent and the national rate rose two-tenths of a percentage point to 3.9 percent.

**Seasonally adjusted total nonfarm jobs in the Erie MSA were essentially unchanged over the month at 126,100 in February.** Over the year, jobs were up 1.1 percent (+1,400) in the MSA while statewide jobs increased 1.2 percent since February 2023.

#### **February Not Seasonally Adjusted Nonfarm Jobs Detail (see Table 2)**

Four of the ten supersectors increased over the month and one declined. Education and health services had a gain of 800 jobs while leisure and hospitality and government picked up 200 jobs each. All those movements were seasonal in nature. Manufacturing had a decline of 300 jobs due in large part to a temporary shutdown. Over the year, five of the ten supersectors were up. The largest increase was in education and health services which expanded by 1,400 jobs (+4.8%). Only professional and business services declined, contracting by 400 jobs (-4.3%) since February of 2023.

**FOOTNOTES**

1) Estimate of workers by place of residence. These data are controlled to state Current Population Survey (CPS) data which adjusts for commuting and dual job-holding. Workers are counted where they live only once regardless of the number of jobs they may hold. All in-depth inquiries relative to the estimating methodology should be addressed to the Bureau of Labor Statistics, U.S. Department of Labor. All data are subject to revision during annual benchmarking.

2) Includes wage and salary workers (including agriculture), self-employed persons, and unpaid family workers (including agriculture), domestic workers, and persons involved in labor-management disputes.

3) Unemployed as percent of civilian labor force, computed using unrounded data.

4) Seasonally adjusted MSA level data (and their equivalent) is developed by the federal Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS); seasonal adjustment for all other sub-state areas are developed by CWIA.
