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BLOOMSBURG-BERWICK MSA MAY UNEMPLOYMENT RATE AT 3.3%

HARRISBURG (JULY 2) - The seasonally adjusted unemployment rate for the Bloomsburg-Berwick Metropolitan Statistical Area (MSA) rose by one-tenth of a percentage point to 3.3 percent in May. The statewide rate was unchanged over the month at 3.4 percent. The national rate rose by one-tenth of a percentage point from its April rate to 4.0 percent. Since last May, the MSA's rate fell by one-tenth of a point, the state's rate rose one-tenth of a point, and the national rate was up three-tenths of a point.

Seasonally adjusted total nonfarm jobs in the Bloomsburg-Berwick MSA were unchanged over the month at its record high of 44,600 in May. Over the year, jobs rose by 1.4 percent (+600) in the MSA, while the statewide jobs' rate of change was 1.6 percent. Detailed industry data for the MSA is not seasonally adjusted.

May's Not Seasonally Adjusted Nonfarm Jobs Detail (see Table 2)

Over the month, all published supersectors (with one exception) were either flat or essentially unchanged. Government was down over the month, driven by the summer break at Bloomsburg University. Although individual industry movements were small, cumulatively they were sufficiently positive to drive private service-providing industries as well as total private employment to record highs. Over the year, employment grew in service-providing industries, while goods-producing jobs were essentially unchanged since last May.
